Here is a list of topic areas your child will be learning during Spring 1.

I hope this guide will help you support your child's learning.

Literacy

In Literacy we will be continuing to learn our letter sounds and will be practicing blending to sound out words. We will be looking at some tricky words that we can't sound out like and, and the. We will continue to write our own names and working on our letter formation in lots of fun and exciting ways linked to our topic. We will be sending home a pack full of fun activities to practice at home after our parent teaching meeting in the coming weeks.



How can I help at home?

Use your child's name card to practice writing their name every day. Share your child's reading book at home at least three times a week. Practise initial sounds using flash cards in the children's book bags, sound out three letter words and our tricky words. The also have a different library book each week to bring home for you to read alongside your child or listen to your child read and discuss the story.

Mathematics

Children will continue to learn to count, read and write numbers to 10 and beyond. We will be using Tens Town to help children remember rhymes on how to write each number and support pencil control.

We are starting to look more at 2D shapes, space and measure and linking this in with our narrative immersion for sticky learning.



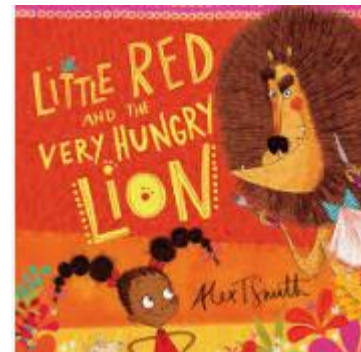
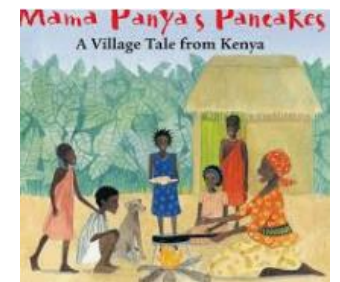
Topic

This half term will see Class RKM asking the question:

What can kindness cure?

We are using 2 books 'Mama Panya's Pancakes' and 'Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion' as stimuli for our learning. We are going to look at different aspects of our lives from those who live in a different country. Comparing what we eat to comparing our homes and daily lives.

We will be looking at the different animals, foods and music throughout our narrative immersion and linking this with our own experiences.



Children will take part in fruit tasting and fruit printing and also comparing an African market from the book to our markets here in our community.

Children will be looking at what it means to be kind and what acts of kindness we can do in school, at home and in the community linking to our school values respect, community and hope.
